The high rates of femicides, transvesticides, transfemicides and Gender-Based Violence (GBV) cases in Argentina show the need to in formulating public policies that will reduce and eventually eradicate GBV and discrimination. In 2021, the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) started an exchange of experiences between the **Republic of Korea** (ROK) and the Province of Córdoba - Argentina, for the initiative: "Implementation of a Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) mechanism to enhance integrated service delivery for women experiencing GBV". It is a Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) Partnership on Addressing Sexual and Gender-Based Violence (SGBV) between the Seoul Sunflower Center (ROK) and the One-Stop Support Center for Women (Province of Córdoba, Argentina).

Based on an analysis and review of the Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) Mechanism implemented by the Sunflower Center model of the ROK, the M&E tool was adapted and developed for the One-Stop Support Center for Women in the Province of Córdoba to enhance the public comprehensive care system for women experiencing GBV and to strengthen the management capacities of the One-Stop Support Center for Women in the Province of Córdoba.




In the context of this project and based on the experience of the One-Stop Support Center for Women in Córdoba, the following effective strategies, approaches and intervention criteria can be identified:

- Interventions in consideration of multiple forms of oppression, discrimination and inequalities faced by individuals.









MULTI-AGENCY AND INTER-INSTITUTIONAL COORDINATION

MONITORING AND EVALUATION (M&E) MECHANISM

This mechanism, adapted for the One–Stop Support Center for Women in the Province of Córdoba, was created on the basis of international and domestic human rights standards. Its purpose is **to improve the public comprehensive care system for women experiencing GBV** and to strengthen the Center's institutional capacities.

To achieve this objective, the mechanism places beneficiaries at the center and enhances the work of government agents.

Facilities and Safety:

Indicators related to entry, reception and assistance rooms, accessibility to facilities; and security measures for beneficiaries and their escorts as well as for service providers.






Management and Human Resources:

Questions regarding the composition and performance of the steering committee, staff capacity building and teamwork.

FOUR KEY EVALUATION CRITERIA:

Service Provision and Human Rights Protection:

Evaluation of the services provided, the referral system, the follow-up services and the protection of the beneficiaries' privacy and confidentiality.



Interview-based Evaluation:

It assesses the performance of the Center's senior management and staff. It takes a deep dive into their roles and functions in the context of work allocation, as it seeks to gather any qualitative information relevant to the enhancement of service delivery, while ensuring the protection and well-being of both the beneficiaries and the staff.

BENEFITS OF THE M&E MECHANISM

- It increases institutional reflexivity.
- It provides updated and systematized data.
- It is oriented toward the achievement of the SDGs set out in the 2030 Agenda.
- It improves the process of decision-making.
- It prioritizes gender equality and violence issues through the collection of data.
- It brings to light partnerships and strategies to prevent isolated or sporadic actions.

The M&E Mechanism is an instrument that seeks to collect data and generate quality information to optimize the services of the One-Stop Support Center for Women, following a comprehensive gender and human rights-based approach.

Innovation: a digital satisfaction survey for beneficiaries

An anonymous and confidential digital tool was designed to gather systematized information from the opinions of the beneficiaries regarding the assistance services provided by the One-Stop Support Center for Women.

It is a virtual survey that collects data on the following:

- The number of visits to the Center.
- The types of services received.
- The overall level of satisfaction with the services provided.
- The level of satisfaction by the types of service received.
- Age, distinguishing between services for adults and for children.

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 It facilitates the collection of feedback through its online survey designed to gather the beneficiaries' opinions on the attention given.

• Consultation about the recommendation of the Center.
